No Outsiders - Everyone Welcome Here

The **No Outsiders** initiative is an inclusive education programme designed for primary schools to promote community cohesion, celebrate diversity, and teach equality, ensuring all children feel they belong.

Created by Andrew Moffat, it uses age-appropriate picture books to teach about the Equality Act 2010, covering topics such as race, religion and sexual orientation.

We already teach about difference, diversity, respect, kindness, multi-cultural, protected characteristics, the Equality Act, British Values..., No Outsiders' lessons and assemblies will enhance our PSHE and RSE provision.

Purpose: To build a school ethos where all children feel safe, valued, and that there are "no outsiders".

Methodology: The program uses picture books to hold discussions in assemblies or lessons. We will add a No Outsiders lesson in to enhance our PSHE units - these will be available to view on our website in the Autumn term.

Core Values: The initiative promotes respect for diversity, community cohesion, and counters fear/hate.

Curriculum Focus: It helps schools meet duties under the Equality Act 2010 to prevent discrimination.

Promoting British Values embedded in the law

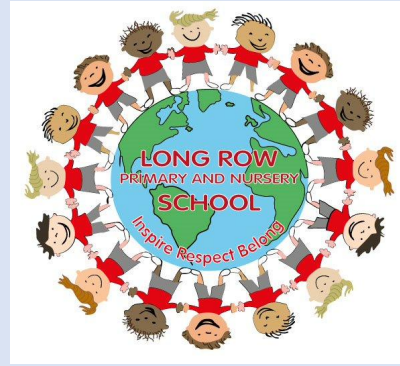
Schools are required to promote mutual respect for different faiths and beliefs as statutory duties as part of the Equality Act.

Short, structured lessons use picture books to introduce themes like kindness, respect and family diversity.

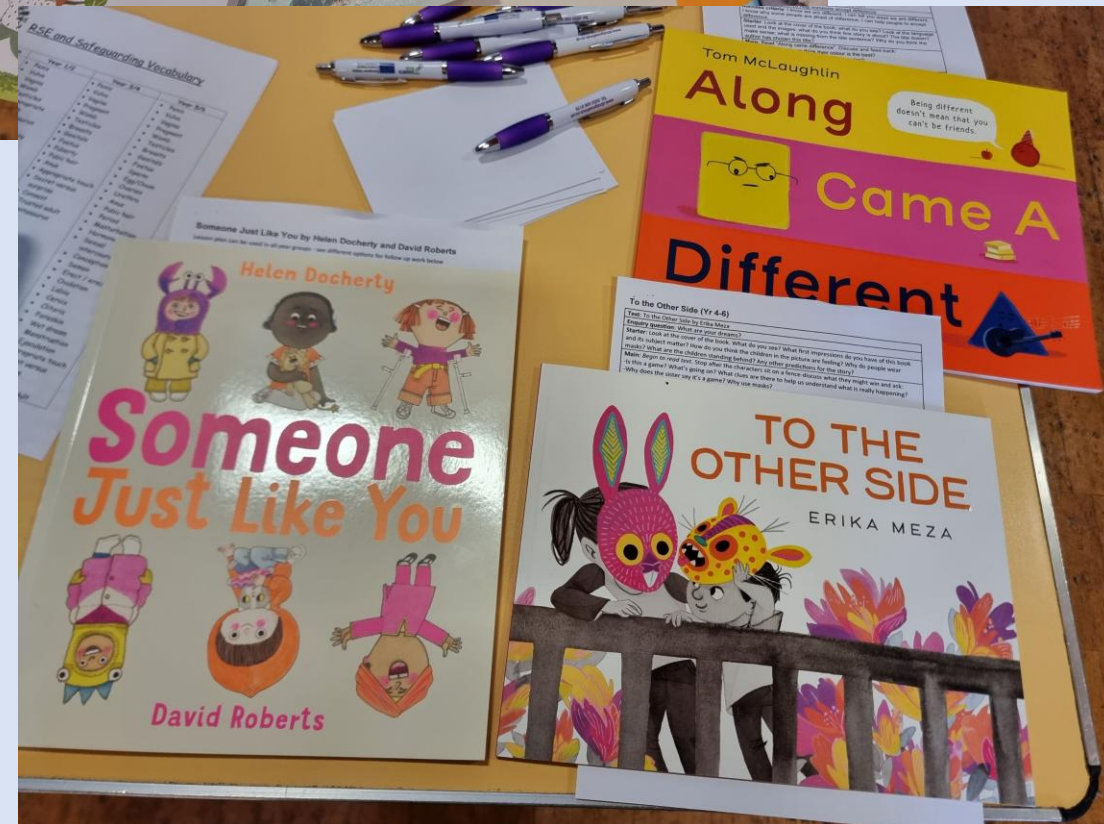
Guided Discussions and Activities

Children engage in guided discussions and simple activities that reinforce inclusion messages sensitively and age-appropriately.

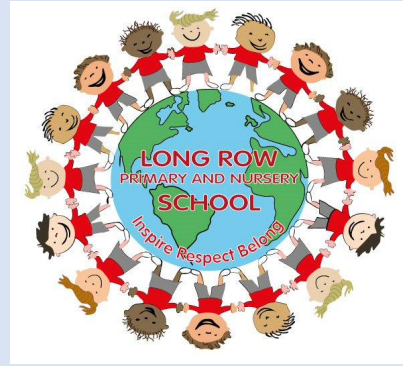
Teacher Training and School Culture

Practical Ways to Reinforce Inclusion at Home



Promote Kindness and Fairness

Encourage talking about kindness and fairness in everyday situations like sharing and helping others.

Read Diverse Books

Reading books featuring different cultures and abilities broadens children's understanding and acceptance.

Model Inclusive Behaviour

Adults show respect for everyone to set an example of inclusion for children.

Engage with School Community

Maintain open communication with school by attending sessions and sharing feedback on inclusion efforts.



Building a Culture of Belonging

Our school is committed to creating an environment where every child feels safe, respected, and included. The introduction of No Outsiders is part of this commitment. We believe that teaching children to value diversity is not only a statutory requirement but a moral imperative that prepares them for life in a modern, global society.
